

# Bachelor of Arts with a Major in Languages/Teacher Licensure

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Through a partnership with the College of Education and Human Development and the Department of Teaching, Leadership & Practice, students may seek teacher licensure in a language. The following program of study must be completed:

I. Requirements for the B.A. with a major in a Language.

II. Humanities requirements:

III. Additional requirements for licensure in French, German or Spanish
